


Reading Cycle Routes

Reading's cycle network connects all the town's major public facilities, employment and leisure areas with almost 37 miles of principle routes, of which 17 miles are segregated from general traffic.

Here's why more and more people are choosing cycling to get around Reading:

- **GETTING THERE FITTER** – Cycling is one of the best forms of exercise.
- **GETTING THERE ON TIME** – In Reading cycling is, particularly at peak times, more reliable and frequently faster than travelling by car.
- **GET THERE FOR LESS** – No fares, no fuel, no road tax, no parking charges.
- **GETTING THERE SAFER** – Reading's cycle network aims to improve safety for cyclists, providing off-road, segregated and quieter routes.
- **GETTING THERE SUSTAINABLY** – Cycling is environmentally friendly.





In 2011 all of the principle routes will be signed, linking through central Reading to Caversham, Tilehurst, Southcote, Coley, Katesgrove, Whitley, Shinfield Rise, Redlands, Newtown and Earley. Also, in co-operation with Wokingham Borough Council, the network has been extended to Woodley and Winnersh.
